
"A broker is an independent party, whose services are used extensively in some industries. A broker's prime responsibility is to bring sellers and buyers together and thus a broker is the thirdperson facilitator between a buyer and a seller."

In short, a broker (technically) is someone who eventually gets paid to help facilitate something. But they don't 'produce' the output itself and are supposed to be independent.

A distinction is made between a 'broker' and an 'agent' – the latter acts on behalf of another to relate with a third party

'Brokering' falls down when there are vested interests – sub prime mortgages...

Context: Knowledge in a world of change




Transformation is inevitable Climate change changes everything

Demand is rapidly growing for 'how to' knowledge



But in research, we often aren't focusing on 'how to'



You can't learn to ride a bicycle just by watching a powerpoint presentation: You have to get on and fall off and learn"

To develop knowledge about 'how to' we need to get our hands dirty to learn how to make change happen.

The role of a broker is thus more than about knowledge, its also about brokering change

i.e. purposeful co-production of knowledge or co-creation of change

1. Building Prototype Floating Homes in Bangladesh



Bangladesh

Large floods:

- Can affect two-thirds of the country (~95,000 sq. km²), 100 million people;
- Destroy homes and livelihood assets
- Exacerbate diverse social and economic challenges
- Inundate homes for 5 months of the year





Concept of an Integrated




Prototype floating homes











6. Reflexivity

Initial team regularly challenged by external evaluator to stimulate reflexivity & keep ambitions high (18 months) Prototypes embody diverse epistemic, practical and normative forms of knowledge from technical experts from outside the community & carpenters, families, children, women, farmers, fishermen, students, & elders from within the community.



Why is it being brokered?	To co-produce new 'artefacts'
Who is it between?	Researchers, local community members, other stakeholders
On behalf of?	A funder
By whom?	Researchers, with some directive and facilitative intensions
Role of 'broker'	Knowledge co-creation, facilitation, project delivery
Independence of broker	LOW/MEDIUM- mostly driving process






The action-research setting

Who is it between?	Local community members, local government and other stakeholders
On behalf of?	A funder and in collaboration with the local authority
By whom?	Researchers, with some directive and facilitative actions
Role of 'broker'	Facilitation, project delivery and research
Independence of broker	MEDIUM (embedded officer) & MEDIUM (PI researcher) & HIGH (Semi-independent evaluator)





What is brokered?	Knowledge about problems, anticipatory knowledge about future possible action, with a goal to stimulate change
Why is it being brokered?	Future transformative planning and action
Who is it between?	Senior leaders in Louisiana Government
On behalf of?	A planning NGO and the Governor
By whom?	Researchers, but with facilitator hats screwed on
Role of 'broker'	Facilitator, with no vested interest in outcome
Degree of independence of broker	HIGH


Clearer separation of facilitators from actors and outcomes
Made easier with intermediary & less vested interest of facilitators who 'step aside' from facilitation



Emphasis on coproduction of knowledge

Scottish Borders

- •Different degrees of separation, depending on the broker involved
- •Some checks and balances in place – e.g. more independent evaluator
- •A collaborator, but this complicates issues - vested interests and unclear roles/aims



Bangladesh

•Less separation of brokers from actors and outcomes

Lower

- Brokers have vested interest and need to deliver outcomes
- But also mechanisms to help handover the stick



Emphasis on cocreation of change

What does this tell us?

- Independence matters
- Is this the most important hallmark of a broker?
- Are brokers then just facilitators?
- Note: Professional facilitators don't take on work when they are not independent
- Likely to be few occasions when we are genuinely operating as an independent broker
- Does this matter?
- We need to be clearer about what we mean when invoking the 'broker' metaphor brokering of what, for what, by whom and for whom?
